#### V. Outreach activities during period:

### WIUM/WIUW-FM

<u>Haddock Scholarship</u>: WIUM/WIUW established the Haddock Scholarship in 1985 and awards funds annually to a student or students with an interest in radio broadcasting. The Haddock Scholarship is awarded during fall semester (October of each year). In April, one \$1,000 scholarship was awarded to student reporters and production assistant Geoff Norfleet.

<u>Talent Grant/Tuition Waiver Awards, Student Payroll and Graduate Assistantships</u>: WIUM/WIUW awards talent grant and tuition waiver stipends to students who wish to pursue a career in radio broadcasting and gain practical experience in the field by working at WIUM/WIUW and the subcarrier Radio Information Service. Recipients of grant and waiver awards work under the direction of full-time professional staff as board operators, announcers, hosts, recording technicians, general assignment reporters, features writers, editors, music librarians, news anchors, and outreach and programming assistants. Twelve Western Illinois University students are currently employed in such paid positions.

<u>Illinois News Broadcasters Association and other Outreach Involvement</u>: WIUM/WIUW encourages its student reporters to join the Illinois News Broadcasters Association, attend its conferences, and apply for INBA scholarships and awards. WIUM/WIUW full-time reporters routinely speak to journalism and broadcasting classes about the stations and broadcast opportunities, and the stations offer tours to student classes each semester. In April of 2012, WIUM/WIUW hosted the Spring Convention of the Illinois News Broadcasters Association, which includes student attendees. INBA Scholarship applicants toured the station and were interviewed by the INBA Board of Directors at WIUM-FM's Macomb studios.

#### **WQPT-TV**

<u>Broadcast Scholarship</u>: WQPT annually awards a \$500 scholarship to a student pursuing the broadcast field. Selection is by written application coordinated and reviewed by a WQPT selection committee. Applications are currently being reviewed for the 2013 scholarship.

<u>EEO On-Air Spot</u>: WQPT regularly broadcasts a spot to encourage organizations to contact the station if they wish to receive lists of job openings. The spot will run, on average, about 20 times a week.

### **Professional Supervisor Training**

Jamie Lange and Dawn Schmitt completed six core sessions and six electives to receive certification. This was offered by Western Illinois University.

### Internship Program

WQPT offered two professional internships to students of Western Illinois University. Two student were interviewed for this position. WQPT also offers 10 Ambassador positions to act as extensions of our staff in outreach activities.

# **Diversity Training**

Alfred Ramirez is a management consultant who specializes in developing and improving the impact of national, regional and local organizations and programs across diverse socio-economic arenas and constituencies. Through one-on-one training or in group settings, he specializes in creating or implementing diversity and inclusion strategies; recruitment and retention plans; and executive and organizational leadership development strategies. He is an expert at facilitating groups and meetings and organizing and managing focus groups. This independent training was completed by all WQPT staff, Community Advisory Board and Development Board.

### Civil Service Book Grant and Tuition Waiver

Certified employees who qualify for educational benefits (see Educational Benefits) may apply for tuition

waiver. Permanent employees in 50-100 percent appointments are eligible for tuition waivers. Employees on probation may enroll in classes with their supervisor's approval. WQPT's Administrative Assistant was granted this waiver and also received the Civil Service Book Award. The Employee Education Award was established in 1982 and five recipients are chosen at random from Civil Service employees actively enrolled at WIU each semester. These awards are subsidized by the Civil Service Award Fund, a WIU foundation fund initiated and supported by employee contributions.
